The Session of First Presbyterian Church, Pasadena, Texas, met Monday, April 15, 2024, at 6:47 p.m.

The following action items were taken:

• The session approved minutes of the stated session meeting on March 18, 2024.

• The current membership is 197.

Brett Coe reported that the March income was \$51,395.78 and the expenses were \$32,312.14 with a net income of \$19083.64 for March.

- The next First Sunday lunch will be May 5.
- Dr. Fair and the musicians, both the choir and instrumentalists, were commended for the meaningful worship during Holy Week.



On May 19th we will be receiving the Pentecost Offering, which is a church-wide effort to support young people and inspire them to share their faith, ideas, and unique gifts with the church and the world. Our gifts to the Pentecost Offering connect with God's hope and future, supporting ministries with children, youth and young adults by building a life of faith. Through the Young Adult Volunteer program, Presbyterian Youth, and Triennium, the "Educate a Child, Transform the World" initiative, we join in ministries that connect young people with one another and with caring communities, helping them shape a life and a future beyond even the one we could plan.

We have seen the results of this offering in action. Our own Shane Webb was called and ordained by our church, as he participated in the Young Adult Volunteer program in Peru. Chrissi Ellis, Darcy McPhail, and Chére Wharry attended Triennium in the summer of 2019. Forty percent of what is received stays locally, and in the past, the Mission and Outreach Ministry has designated this for Covenant House Texas, which ministers to homeless, abused, and abandoned youth ages 18 to 24 in Houston.
