Dear Friends,

I recently had lunch with a long-time friend. Since we are in the season of Lent, she asked me about preaching on Easter. I admitted that, though it is the high point of the Christian year, it is one of the most difficult Sundays to preach. It is the one annual chance we preachers get to proclaim the good news to some people. Then there is the difficulty of bodily resurrection. There are no illustrations from our daily lives.

One problem with preaching resurrection is confusion between immortality and resurrection. They are distinct. Frederick Buechner, a Presbyterian minister you've heard me quote before, makes important distinctions between them in his book, *Wishful Thinking*. In his inimitable way, Buechner writes, "Immortality means death-proof. To believe in the immortality of the soul is to believe that though John Brown's body lies a-mouldering in the grave, his soul goes marching on simply because marching on is the nature of souls just the way producing apples is the nature of apple trees. Bodies die, but souls don't. True or false, this is not the biblical view."

God creates us in bodily form -- body and soul joined together -- and proclaims his creation "good." As Buechner writes, "The biblical understanding of man is not that he has a body but that he is a body." When we die, we die -- body and soul, to continue with that language. In other words we are by our very nature decidedly mortal, not immortal. Jesus gives us not immortality but resurrection, new life. Just as God gives us this life, God gives us the new life that is to come. New life is absolutely not something that happens because of something inherently human but something that happens only because of the power and might and love of God. God's greatness -- and God's great love -- is exactly what we celebrate on Easter. Christ is Risen!!! Christ is raised by the power and might and love of God. Thanks be to God!

I hope you will worship with us throughout Holy Week. April 13 is Palm Sunday. We will celebrate Jesus' entry into Jerusalem with its ominous forebodings. On Maundy Thursday (April 17), we will gather in the Fellowship Hall at 6:00 for a light supper and the Lord's Supper, remembering Jesus' last supper with his disciples. On Good Friday (April 18), we will have a noon service in the sanctuary. Going through the trials and trauma of the week make the joy of Easter morning so much more meaningful.

May God bless us as we remember and rejoice.

The session of First Presbyterian Church, Pasadena, Texas, met in a session meeting called by Dr. Fair on March 2, 2025, at 11:35 a.m. in the sanctuary. Gay and Keith Reeves were received into membership by transfer of letter.

The session of First Presbyterian Church, Pasadena, Texas, met on March 9, 2025, at 10:00 a.m. in the Bride's Room in a meeting called by Dr. Fair for the purpose of hearing a request regarding the use of the building. Brett Coe moved that St. George Orthodox Christian Church be allowed to lease the sanctuary and Fellowship Hall one Saturday a month. The motion was seconded, and following discussion, the motion was approved.

+++++++

The session of First Presbyterian Church, Pasadena, Texas, met in a stated meeting on Monday, March 17, 2025, in the Fellowship Hall.

**The following action items were taken.**

- The Mission and Outreach Ministry moved to add a line item for the electronic church sign. After discussion, the motion was tabled.
- The session **ratified** the Early Childhood Program Board's hiring of Heather McDonald to be the Early Childhood Program Director effective May 15, 2025. Carrie Reed will be retiring after 12 years as director.

**The following reports were given.**

- The current membership is 195.
- Brett reported the February income was \$18,629 and the expenses were \$26,330 for a net loss of \$7701. For the year there is a net loss of \$24,916. Starting the year there was \$148,723 in pre-pledged money. Beginning in March, \$14,782 of those funds will be moved into the general checking account each month. This should correct the net loss over the next few months.
- A lift has been rented, and work is being done to repair the parking lot lights, replace stained ceiling tiles, replace burned out lights, and change canned lights to LED lights.
- Dr. Fair thanked the Caring and Fellowship Ministry for all their efforts in helping make the Valentine's spaghetti supper, the Shrove Tuesday pancake supper, and the 85th anniversary barbeque dinner benefit successful.

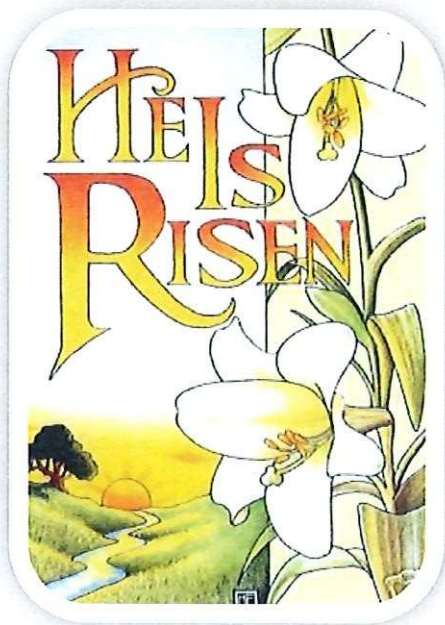

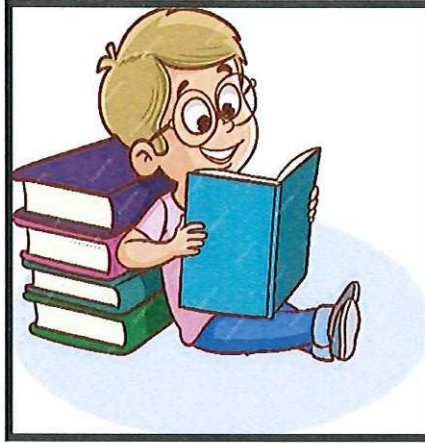

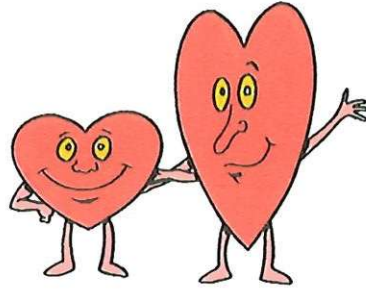
