**Clerk's Corner**

The session of First Presbyterian Church, Pasadena, Texas, met in a stated meeting on Monday, April 14, 2025, in Fellowship Hall.

**The session approved:**

- Removing three former members who have joined other churches from the membership rolls,
- Holding Taco and a Prayer on May 8, 2025, and
- Allowing the following pastors to serve as guest preachers:
  - May 4 — Rev. Tom Sharon, retired PCUSA pastor (Dr. Fair out for continuing education)
  - May 11 — Rev. David Fletcher, retired PCUSA pastor who grew at FPCP (85th anniversary series)
  - June 29 — Rev. Ted Foote, retired PCUSA pastor who served a 15-month seminary internship at FPCP (85th anniversary series)
  - October 5 — Rev. Dr. Jim Gill, retired PCUSA pastor (Dr. Fair on vacation)
  - October 12 — Rev. Dr. Jim Currie, retired PCUSA pastor and former FPCP pastor (85th anniversary series)

**The following reports were given:**

- The current membership is 192.
- Brett reported the March income was \$39,413.77 and the expenses were \$29,037.25 for a net gain of \$10,736.52. Note that pre-pledge monies are now being moved to general checking.
- Note that the 'for the year' deficit has reduced to (\$14,539) now that pre-pledged money is being moved. This number should continue to reduce unless there are unforeseen expenses.
- Bonnie Keith will be the liaison between the Discipleship Ministry and nursery attendant, Yulissa Delgado. She and Samantha Cayton will rotate being a second person in the nursery as needed.

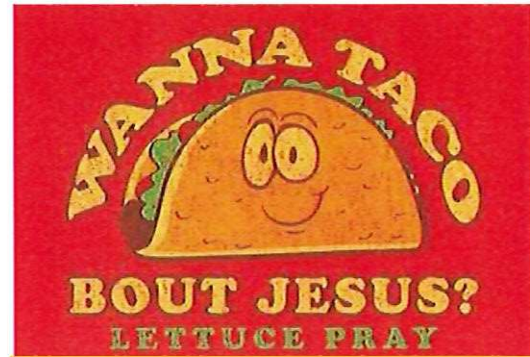

**RE:** Ongoing and Upcoming Quilting/Sewing Projects — *for anyone, whether you sew or not!*

**FIRST** — May 1, we began a project for the Animal Shelter making 1) **dog collars**, 2) **cat pads for their beds**, AND 3) **dog toys from old T-shirts**. Donna brought the pattern and instructions for the dog collars to get everyone started. There is plenty of fabric and elastic to use for this project. See Donna for the pattern and fabric. This is a fun and easy project to work on at home.

**SECOND** — May 8, Thursday, Donna will teach us how to make a **Quilt As You Go Baby Quilt**. A super easy strip quilt. She will go over all the details on **May 8** to get us started. And we will make it at the **May 15** Chain Stitcher class. This will give you time to get your supplies.

**THIRD** — **Save the date, June 14**. This is the BIGGY! Donna has arranged an event for The Chain Stitchers to have a sewing day in the Fellowship Hall on June 14th starting at 8:00 am. **We will each be making a Quilt Top from the same pattern. However, we will each be using different fabrics!** A 'Turning Twenty Pattern' was selected by majority vote. It is a very easy pattern, made from 20 Fat Quarters. Donna has a TON of fat quarters to choose from and use. On June 14, you will come to the event with your fabric ironed and already cut by the instructions. We should be able to complete the top that day. It is so much fun to see how a pattern looks quite different when you use different fabrics. Breakfast, lunch, and snacks will be divided among those attending. **All details will be given at the May 8 and May 15 Chain Stitcher class**. This will give you time to look over all the materials required and bring your questions to Donna at any Thursday class *prior* to June 14. Remember, to mark your calendar for July 14 and plan of having a great day of sewing and fellowship!

**Chain Stitchers regularly meet in the Fellowship Hall on Thursdays from NOON to 3:00.  
Bring your sewing machine and sewing kit.**

**The Prayer Shawl Ministry** meets Wednesday afternoons from 1:30-3:00 in Room #10 and Zoom. During this time, they crochet and knit, teach others these skills, and pray for others. The results of their efforts are prayer shawls that are gifted to those who are going through sorrow, pain, hard times, as well as times of joy and celebration. 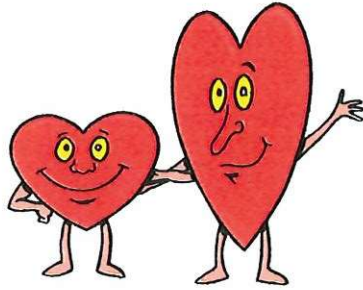

## History Memories of First Presbyterian Church of Pasadena, Texas

by Diane Walker Hall, the "oldest child" in this Church

I moved to Pasadena, Texas in January 1937 with my family from North Carolina. My father T. B. Walker and a group of men came to open Champion Paper Mill Company. There were many Presbyterians in this group. They invited us to visit the little Mission Church that met in a business building.

The church and Pasadena begin to grow between 1937-1940. The Mission Church bought property on the corner of Broadway and Randall. They then bought a small wooden white building that belonged to Pasadena School District and moved it on this property.

Under the leadership of Dick Fairfield, Al Poirrier and the men of the church built an entrance on the front of the building because men wore hats, and they needed a place to hang their hats. Another member built a wooden pulpit to preach from and that pulpit is still used in the fellowship hall. Sunday School for adults met in the four corners of the sanctuary. It had a large grand piano that Mrs. Page played.

The church grew and became a Charter Church in 1940 with 48 Mission Church members. My parents, T. B. and Hazel Walker, and son, Jack, were part of the Charter members. I was seven years old at that time.

Rev. Dr. King from First Presbyterian Church of Houston preached the sermon when we became a Charter Church. He said, "call your church First Presbyterian Church not Pasadena Presbyterian Church". The next day the sign was changed to First Presbyterian Church. Rev. King also gave us a Bible that is displayed in the cabinet below the stained glass of Jesus in our narthex.

The women of the church and children took turns cleaning the church each week. I remember helping my mother, Hazel Walker. We loved this little white church. (I asked my mother to paint the little white church picture when we celebrated 50 years.)

As there was no air conditioning in the church, we used electric fans and hand fans. The sounds of the people and animals were heard when windows were open. The Gooch family went to our church and their son, Billy, played the violin solos during our services.

Church family life in our church was so important to all our lives. It was great training for our families and for this church. I know it has produced many great Christians throughout the years.
